**Question of the Week
August 20, 2023**



All catechesis flows from the liturgy nothing is as important as what happens at the Sunday Mass. Christ is present in four fold ways, in the bread and wine, the Presider, the word of God and the community gathered. But for a lot of people the Sunday mass and readings and homily goes too quickly. Question of the Week:

Adults: When you pray, how do you know that Jesus will really respond?

Children: Do you trust that God hears your prayers? Do you believe that your prayer makes a difference?

Reading 2: Rom 11:13-15, 29-32

Gospel: Mt 15:21-28
