It's Synod Time!

On October 10, 2021, Pope Francis opened a threeyear process in the Catholic Church called a Synod. Now, if you're a Catholic who even knows what Synod is, you are probably thinking of a bunch of bishops getting together with the Pope in Rome, and thinking up something inspiring to tell the rest of the Church. In this Synod, though, Pope Francis had turned that model on its head, and called for a process that consults with ALL the Church! Over the next few months, parishes around the world will be holding "consultations," opportunities for Catholics to reflect on their experience of the Church, and where the Holy Spirit is calling us. These reflections, in turn, will go to the diocese, then to the U.S. Bishops, and eventually to the worldwide gathering of bishops at the Vatican in 2023. The parish is in the process of gathering a committee to discern, reflect and dialogue about issues that are facing our community. Please watch for updates in upcoming bulletins.
