

National HIV/AIDS strategy – 2022-2025

The Strategy articulates a clear vision to guide the nation's response to HIV: The United States will be a place where new HIV infections are prevented, every person knows their status, and every person with HIV has high-quality care and treatment. The Strategy sets bold targets for ending the HIV epidemic in the United States by 2030, including a 75% reduction in new HIV infections by 2025 and a 90% reduction by 2030. To guide the nation toward realizing the vision, the Strategy focuses on four goals:

Prevent new HIV infections.

Improve HIV-related health outcomes of people with HIV.

Reduce HIV-related disparities and health inequities.

Achieve integrated, coordinated efforts that address the HIV epidemic among all partners and stakeholders.

Interesting Data

Recent data from the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA) at Georgetown University showed that <u>just 4%</u> of new Catholic priests last year in the United States were Black or African. A separate study published in 2021 estimated that only 4% of men and women entering religious life in America since 2005 were Black or African, with 82% having been born overseas.
