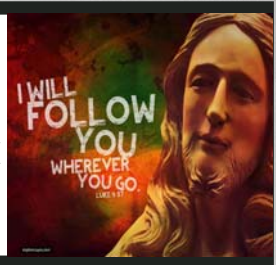

Question of the Week
June 26, 2022



All catechesis flows from the liturgy nothing is as important as what happens at the Sunday Mass. Christ is present in four fold ways, in the bread and wine, the Presider, the word of God and the community gathered. But for a lot of people the Sunday mass and readings and homily goes too quickly. In order for people to think back on the mass, we will have the "Question of the Week". The purpose of the "Question of the Week" is to bring together people of all ages to learn about and share their faith. The question will be relating to one of the readings from Sunday's Mass. The question will allow different ministry groups and families to break open the word and share faith throughout the week.

Question of the Week:

Adults: Sometimes we are like the people in the Gospel and have many excuses for why we cannot follow Jesus. Name a time this past week that you followed Jesus even though you had many excuses.

Children/Youth: To follow Jesus means to do what is right. Name a time this past week when you followed Jesus by doing the right thing you were asked to do, the first time, without an excuse.

Reading 2: Gal 5:1,13-18

Gospel: Lk 9:51-62

**RCIA is short for the
"Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults."**

RCIA is the normative process where those who are interested in the Catholic Church have a time of teaching and discernment about a possible call to full participation in Catholicism.

RCIA is open to:

- Those adults who have not been baptized and are spiritually looking.
- Those adults who have been baptized in a recognized non-Catholic Christian tradition.
- Those adults who were baptized Catholic but have not celebrated Eucharist and Communion.
- Those who just want to learn more about the Catholic Faith.

Participating in RCIA does not mean that you have to become Catholic, but it does help you discern as to whether God is calling you to join the Catholic Faith.

East End Career Opportunities Workshop.

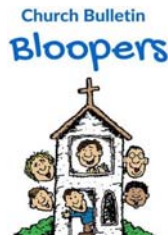
