Question of the Week January 14, 2024



All catechesis flows from the liturgy nothing is as important as what happens at the Sunday Mass. Gospel: Jn 1:35-42



In the Gospel today, Jesus asks "What are you looking for?" Often, we are looking for happiness in very selfish ways, but we find that when we look for ways to make others happy, it is then that we truly become happy.

As you donate your gift to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, know that you are a sign of God's love to those who are suffering, and you give them reason to believe and to trust.


AIDS Spiritual Reflections
