Question of the Week December 24, 2023



All catechesis flows from the liturgy nothing is as important as what happens at the Sunday Mass. Question of the Week:

Adults: Name one area of your life where God has surprised you with love, abilities, or even a pregnancy. How is God's Spirit upon you in this dimension of life? Children: Gabriel's greeting to Mary was, "Hail, favored one! The Lord is with you." This is God's greeting to each of us – he loves us just as we are. What are some of your personal strengths that God rejoices in?

ANNUAL DIOCESAN APPEAL 2023-2024 —Sharing His Love With Others



The dialogue of the Annunciation crackles with questions and shocking answers. "You will conceive in your womb and bear a son." (Luke 1:31) "How can this be?" (Luke 1:34) "The Holy Spirit will come upon you." (Luke 1:35) "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord." (Luke 1:38)

The Annunciation was a kind of verbal dance. It began with Gabriel's lead. It ended with the Son of Man dwelling in Mary. Renaissance paintings of the Annunciation sometimes show Mary in what's called a *contrapposto*: an asymmetrical stance of in which the line of the arms and shoulders balances, the line of the hips and legs. Mary's *contrapposto* posture conveys a sense of movement, reaction, and surprise... and peace!

As we near the end of Advent, there is still time to support our Annual Diocesan Appeal. By giving, you can make more room for Christ to enter your life and allow the Holy Spirit to converse with you. Have you heard His voice lately? His voice communicates calm and balance while also asking for a response.

We may find ourselves both surprised and strangely at peace when He speaks. Don't be afraid to ask and listen, as Mary did. Please respond generously. As the angel, Gabriel, told Mary, "Do not be afraid... for you have found favor with God." You have found His favor, too. He is coming!
