Question of the Week September 1, 2024



All catechesis flows from the liturgy nothing is as important as what happens at the Sunday Mass. Christ is present in four fold ways, in the bread and wine, the Presider, the word of God and the community gathered. But for a lot of people the Sunday mass and readings and homily goes too quickly. In order for people to think back on the mass, we will have the "Question of the Week". The purpose of the "Question of the Week" is to bring together people of all ages to learn about and share their faith. The question will be relating to one of the readings from Sunday's Mass. The question will allow different ministry groups and families to break open the word and share faith throughout the week.

Question of the Week:

Adults: Based on this reading from James, what is the sign in one's life that faith is present. **Children:** What steps can you take to more humbly welcome Christ into your heart?

Reading 1: Dt 4:1-2,6-8

Reading 2: Jas 1:17-18,21b-22,27 **Gospel:** Mk 7:1-8,14-15,21-23



The gospel today hits home closer than we may think. What traditions do we blindly cling to? Perhaps it is enough for us just to go to Mass on Sunday? Do we keep the letter of the law and miss entirely the spirit of the law. Interior righteousness means a heart turned to God. Purity of heart is expressed in righteous living: self - giving for the sake of others.

Born into slavery in Haiti, Toussaint became a freeman, successful businessman, and philanthropist in New York City. He is the only lay person

honored, alongside cardinal-archbishops, with burial in the crypt of St. Patrick.
