Question of the Week August 24, 2025



All catechesis flows from the liturgy nothing is as important as what happens at the Sunday Mass. Christ is present in four fold ways, in the bread and wine, the Presider, the word of God and the community gathered. But for a lot of people the Sunday mass and readings and homily goes too quickly. Question of the Week:

Adults: As you wrestle with today's Gospel, what signs do you see in your own life that you are "with God."

Children: Jesus tells us that being His disciple will be very hard. Of all the things that Jesus tells us about the way that we are to live our lives, what is the hardest thing for you to do? Why?

Reading 1: Is 66:18-21

Reading 2: Heb 12:5-7,11-13

Gospel: Lk 13:22-30

Parishioners of Holy Rosary Catholic Church (HRCC) can have select documents notarized at **no cost.**


- **By appointment only**. Meeting location at the HRCC office during business hours or another approved location, such as a public library.
